Recent developments vital for the Company

On November 15 the Company released selected preliminary financial results for 2Q21 (encompassing the period since July 1 till September 30).

2Q21 sales constituted no surprise as the Company releases the monthly data regularly, at the beginning of the following month. Grodno claims that materially higher yoy sales in the RES segment and in the segment of cables and wires exerted the biggest positive impact on the revenues and income items. Besides, the Company has been experiencing a growth of revenues in all the remaining business segments with the EBITDA margin at 5.1% comparable to the high 1Q21 level (vs 2.5% in 2Q20), which became a positive surprise. When analyzing the improvement in the released financials, it should be remembered that in 1H20 Grodno obtained financial aid in the amount of PLN 3.5 million within the government 'Anti-crisis Shield', which affected positively the results then. Additionally, a positive impact in the previous year came from shifting the bonus payments for employees to subsequent periods in 2020.

Forecasts review

2Q21 results are good indeed and prompt us to revise our financial forecasts. The best way to do this would be to prepare a separate forecast for each business segment (6), as the growth profile for each of them is different. Unfortunately, the Company does not reveal the historical data split by segments due to the trade secret and, therefore, our sales forecast encompasses all the segments.

It seems certain that the growth driver for the Company will be the RES segment, though the electrotechnical, heating and lightening segments should grow as well.

Valuation

With the upgrade of financial forecasts, our 12M EFV has increased.

We implement two methods in the valuation of the Company: DCF FCFF method and peer-relative

valuation based on the EV/EBITDA, EV/EBIT and P/E multiples. In the peer-relative valuation we compare Grodno against a set of Polish companies listed on the WSE.

In our DCF model we implement the following assumptions:

- the residual growth at 1.5% (no change),
- unleveraged Beta at 1.1% (no change),
- the market risk premium at 6.0% (previously 6.5%),
- the risk free rate at 2.9% (previously 2.0%).

Our 12M DCF EFV implies PLN 25.4 per share. The peer-relative exercise is based on domestic peers and forward multiples for 2021-23E: P/E, EV/EBITDA and EV/EBIT. The peer-implied EFV yields PLN 21.2 per share. Ultimately, our 12M target EFV calculated as the arithmetic average of both valuations stands at PLN 23.3 per share.

The advantage of the former is the fact that it incorporates the current market assessment of the value of the company's peers. The weakness of the comparative method is the risk that the valuation benchmark may be mispriced. The advantage of the DCF method is its independence from the current market valuation of the comparable companies. The weakness of this method is its high sensitivity to undertaken assumptions, especially those related to the residual value calculation. Please note that we also resort to other valuation techniques (e.g. NAV-, DDM- or SOTP-based), should it prove appropriate in a given case

DM BOŚ S.A. generally values the covered banks via two methods: comparative method and fundamental target fair P/E and target fair P/BV multiples method. The advantage of the former is the fact that it incorporates the current market assessment of the value of the company's peers. The weakness of the comparative method is the risk that the valuation benchmark may be mispriced. The advantage of the fundamental target fair P/E and target fair P/BV multiples method is its independence of the current market valuation of the comparable companies. The weakness of this method is its high sensitivity to undertaken assumptions, especially those

related to the residual value calculation. Assumptions used in valuation can change, influencing thereby the level of the valuation. Among the most important assumptions are: GDP growth, forecasted level of inflation, changes in interest rates and currency prices, employment level and change in wages, demand on the analysed company products, raw material prices, competition, standing of the main customers and suppliers, legislation changes, etc. Changes in the environment of the analysed company are monitored by analysts involved in the preparation of the recommendation, estimated, incorporated in valuation and published in the recommendation whenever needed.

KEY TO INVESTMENT RANKINGS

This is a guide to expected price performance in absolute terms over the next 12 months:

Buy - fundamentally undervalued (upside to 12M EFV in excess of the cost of equity) + catalysts which should close the valuation gap identified;

Hold - either (i) fairly priced, or (ii) fundamentally undervalued/overvalued but lacks catalysts which could close the valuation gap;

Sell - fundamentally overvalued (12M EFV < current share price + 1-year cost of equity) + catalysts which should close the valuation gap identified.

This is a guide to expected relative price performance:

Overweight - expected to perform better than the benchmark (WIG) over the next quarter in relative terms Neutral - expected to perform in line with the benchmark (WIG) over the next quarter in relative terms Underweight - expected to perform worse than the benchmark (WIG) over the next quarter in relative terms

The recommendation tracker presents the performance of DM BOŚ S.A.'s recommendations. A recommendation expires on the day it is altered or on the day 12 months after its issuance, whichever comes first. Relative performance compares the rate of return on a given recommended stock in the period of the recommendation's validity (i.e. from the date of issuance to the date of alteration or – in case of maintained recommendations – from the date of issuance to the current date) in a relation to the rate of return on the benchmark in this time period. The WIG index constitutes the benchmark. For recommendations that expire by an alteration or are maintained, the ending values used to calculate their absolute and relative performance are: the stock closing price on the day the recommendation expires/ is maintained and the closing value of the benchmark on that date.
